RESIGNATION FORM OF DAVID J. KRULL (ELC 9.3(b))

I, David J. Krull, declare as follows:

DAVID J. KRULL,

Lawyer (Bar No. 22483).

- I am over the age of eighteen years and am competent. I make the statements in this declaration from personal knowledge.
 - 2. I was admitted to practice law in the State of Washington on May 24, 1993.
- 3. After consultation with my counsel, Peter Offenbecher, I have voluntarily decided to resign from the Washington State Bar Association (the Association) in Lieu of Discipline under Rule 9.3 of the Rules for Enforcement of Lawyer Conduct (ELC).
- 4. Attached hereto as Exhibit A is Disciplinary Counsel's statement of alleged misconduct for purposes of ELC 9.3(b). I am aware of the alleged misconduct stated in

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Disciplinary Counsel's statement and, rather than defend against the allegations, I wish to permanently resign from membership in the Association.

- 5. I consent to entry of an order under ELC 13.9(e) assessing expenses of \$1,500 in this matter.
- 6. I understand that my resignation is permanent and that any future application by me for reinstatement as a member of the Association is currently barred. If the Supreme Court changes this rule or an application is otherwise permitted in the future, it will be treated as an application by one who has been disbarred for ethical misconduct. If I file an application, I will not be entitled to a reconsideration or reexamination of the facts, complaints, allegations, or instances of alleged misconduct on which this resignation was based.
- 7. I agree to (a) notify all other states and jurisdictions in which I am admitted of this resignation in lieu of discipline; (b) seek to resign permanently from the practice of law in such jurisdictions; and (c) provide disciplinary counsel with copies of this notification and any response(s). I acknowledge that this resignation could be treated as a disbarment by all other jurisdictions.
- 8. I agree to (a) notify all other professional licensing agencies in any jurisdiction from which I have a professional license that is predicated on my admission to practice law of this resignation in lieu of discipline; (b) seek to resign permanently from any such license; and (c) provide disciplinary counsel with copies of any of these notifications and any responses.
- 9. I agree that when applying for any employment, I will disclose the resignation in lieu of discipline in response to any question regarding disciplinary action or the status of my license to practice law.

19	2. From March 2001 to June 2008.	, Respondent was employed by a business entity
20	(the Business) as General Counsel and Corporate Secretary.	
21	3. In 2007, Respondent established	d a fictitious vendor to pay himself with funds
22 23	belonging to the Business for services not rendered.

1	4. Respondent did this for personal financial gain even though he knew it was	
2	improper and unlawful.	
3	5. As a result of this conduct, Respondent received \$95,500 to which he was not	
4	entitled.	
5	6. In May 2008, Respondent attempted to submit for payment an additional invoice in	
6	the amount of \$17,500 to which he was not entitled.	
7	7. Respondent also created a fictitious personal injury claim in order to pay himself	
8	with funds belonging to the Business to which he was not entitled.	
9	8. As a result of this conduct, Respondent received \$65,500 to which he was not	
10	entitled.	
11	III. ALLEGED MISCONDUCT.	
12	9. By engaging in the conduct set forth above, Respondent violated RPC 8.4(b)	
13	(criminal act that reflects adversely on the lawyer's honesty, trustworthiness or fitness), RPC	
14	8.4(c) (conduct involving dishonesty, fraud, deceit or misrepresentation), and RPC 8.4(n)	
15	(conduct demonstrating unfitness to practice law).
