ORDER PURSUANT TO ELC 9.2



On January 29, 2018, the Idaho Supreme Court filed an order suspending Kristian Scott Beckett from the practice of law for 60 days, with 32 days of that suspension withheld followed by six months of probation. Mr. Beckett was disciplined because he failed to explain a matter to the extent reasonably necessary to permit his client to make informed decisions regarding the representation, and because he failed to hold property of clients or third persons that was in his possession in connection with a representation separate from his own property. Upon notification of the action of the Supreme Court of the State of Idaho, this Court issued an order, pursuant to ELC 9.2(c), directing Mr. Beckett to inform this Court of any claim that the imposition of identical discipline in this state would be unwarranted. Mr. Beckett was served with a copy of the order on or about April 28, 2018. As of this date, no response has been filed. The Court reviewed the file in this matter and has determined unanimously that the following order should be entered. Now, therefore, it is hereby

## ORDERED:

The Washington State Supreme Court hereby imposes reciprocal discipline in the State of Washington. Kristian Scott Beckett is suspended from the practice of law for 60 days, with 32 days of that suspension withheld followed by six months of probation. Pursuant to ELC 13.2, the effective date of the 28-day suspension is seven days from the date of this order.
