
Todd Stephen Hammond is currently an active member of the Washington State Bar Association (WSBA). On January 31, 2020, the Supreme Court of the State of Oregon entered an Order suspending Todd Stephen Hammond from the practice of law in Oregon for 60 days, all of which was stayed pending successful completion of a two-year term of probation. Todd Stephen Hammond was disciplined for violating Oregon's RPC 1.5(a) and RPC 1.8(a). The WSBA notified this Court of the suspension on February 11, 2020, and the Clerk stayed this matter pursuant to ELC 9.2(d) until the stay in Oregon expired. On February 1, 2022, the WSBA advised the Court by letter that the Oregon State Bar had closed its file on the case because Todd Stephen Hammond had successfully completed the terms of his probation. At that time, the stay was lifted and the Court entered an order pursuant to ELC 9.2(c) directing Todd Stephen Hammond to inform this Court why it should not impose the identical discipline in this state. On March 30, 2022, Todd Stephen Hammond filed a response. On April 1, 2022, the WSBA filed a letter expressing no objection to retroactive imposition of any reciprocal discipline so that it coincides with the effective date of discipline ordered by the State of Oregon. The Court reviewed the file in this matter and determined unanimously that the following order should be entered.

IT IS ORDERED:

The Washington State Supreme Court does hereby reciprocate discipline in the State of Washington. Todd Stephen Hammond is suspended from the practice of law for 60 days, effective January 31, 2020, with the entire suspension stayed based on the successful completion of the two-year term of probation in Oregon.
